Oslo Marathon - September 21



Come September and it's Oslo Marathon time. For the third year in a row, the International Forum is organising an 'Ambassadors for Peace' team to participate in the Marathon. The 10-km run ('10 for Grete') will take place on Saturday, September 21 at about 16:00, starting at the Town Hall. The run will end by 18:00.

Mona Dorit Levin (1939) is a well-known Norwegian journalist, author, actress and theatre critic. For many years, she was part of the cultural editorial team at *Aftenposten*, writing the culture and entertainment columns. From 1996, she has worked as a freelance author and theatre critic.

Ms Levin is the daughter of the famous Jewish pianist and composer Robert Levin.

Ms Levin has written many books about famous Norwegian actors and politicians, including her father's biography.

Her last book, *Mors Historie – En familiesaga* (My Mother's Story: A Family Saga), recounts the tale of her mother's family through generations. It is a s story of migration and survival.

Villa Stenersen

September 24



Special Events has pleasure in inviting you to visit Villa Stenersen, situated on a hill in Tuengen Allé, with a lovely view over the fjord. This house, with specially designed interior and furnishings, is one of the most significant examples of Norwegian Modernism and one of architect Arne Kosmo's most well-known works. Rolf C. E. Stenersen – financier, art collector and author – had this house built for himself and his family in 1939. In 1974, he donated the villa to the nation. He wished it to be used as the prime minister's official residence, but only one prime minister, Oddvar Nordli, has lived there. In 2014, the National Museum took over the administration of the villa, and it is now a museum. Villa Stenersen is the only Norwegian house museum that is included in the international network 'Iconic Houses', a collection of modern houses designed by significant architects and open to the public. We are looking forward to taking Forum members on a guided tour of this remarkable house and its garden.


