Roseslottet – The 'Rose Castle' Outdoor Exhibition – September 10

Welcome back to the Art Committee's activities! Because of the Corona pandemic, we have chosen an outdoor event in September.

This year marks the 80th anniversary of Nazi Germany's invasion of Norway in 1940 and the 75th anniversary of the liberation in May 1945. Overlooking the City of Oslo, a spectacular art project on Norway during World War II and the country's loss of freedom can now be seen and explored. During the five years of occupation, the fundamental principles of a constitutional state, democracy and humanism were invalidated.

Behind Frognerseteren T-bane station, you can enter a wondrous and thought-provoking art installation – a gigantic golden castle that is visible from the city centre – designed by Eimund and Vebjørn Sand, who have worked on this art installation for a number of years, and the result is now displayed just behind Frognerseteren T-bane station.

There is good news and bad news. The bad news is that the Oslo 2020 Marathon has been cancelled, understandably, due to the pandemic. The good news is that a 'virtual' marathon will take place on September 19.

You can choose the time, pace, distance and the place to run between 00:00 and 23:59 on the day of the event (worldwide). You can run alone or with friends so long as you maintain your social distance. On completing the run, you can get your medal. What happens if you cheat? The organisers reply: 'You can try. We promise you: it will not be pretty!'

Since it is a virtual race this year, there will be no Ambassadors for Peace team registered. You must therefore sign up individually. Registration costs NOK 150.-. Your family and friends in other parts of the world may register and run in their location.

Oslo Marathon cooperates with the charities *Aktiv mot kreft* ('Active for the cancer cause') and *Right to play*. When you register to participate, you have the option to support one of these organisations with a donation.

Global Outlook Norway 2020



'Arendalsuka', Norway's much acclaimed annual political festival, usually draws 75,000 people to beautiful Arendal on the southern coast of Norway. This year, it was cancelled due to the pandemic. However, the political Party Leaders' Debate and Global Outlook Norway, were held as scheduled. Global Outlook, normally arranged on the opening day of Arendalsuka, was held as a 'hybrid' event on location in Arendal, connecting live to speakers in London, Singapore and Brussels. This year's theme was Conflict or Cooperation in the 2020s: US-China relations. The first speaker is always the Foreign Minister of Norway. This was the third time Foreign Minister Ine Eriksen Søreide made a keynote address to the gathering. The event was moderated by Anita Pratap.
